Since its creation by founder and Artistic Director, Daniel Johnson, Texas Early Music Project has charmed central Texas audiences with intriguing, evocative, and innovative concerts. Johnson specializes in the

music of Medieval and Renaissance Spain and France, the Sephardim, the early Baroque works of Monteverdi and Charpentier, and ballads from 17th and 18th century Scotland. He directs the Texas Toot Early Music Workshop and is a co-director of the Amherst Early Music Festival. He was inducted into the Austin Arts Hall of Fame in the spring of 2009.

When TEMP was founded in 1987, our concerts were an occasional event around Austin and College Station, annual concerts at the Early Music at Round Top Festival, and with the UT Opera Department. However, in 1998 we decided to take a huge gamble by creating the Annual Mid-Winter Festival of Music: Six Weekends of Early Music Enchantment. After four years of the festival, the next logical step was setting up a less frenzied concert rhythm, between September and May. And here we are, twenty years later, reflecting on the past and excited about the musical future. We have performed more than 100 programs since 2002, showcasing legendary composers such as Hildegard, Josquin, Monteverdi, Schütz, Charpentier, Handel, and the ever-present and long-lived Anonymous, and we have also taken the opportunity to explore less wellknown repertoires from across seven centuries and from many countries.

At TEMP, we continue our search to present enchanting musical treasures that connect with modern lives and modern needs. At the same time, we celebrate our favorite music for its power to turn back time and to bring back a thousand memories of concerts performed, friends who are still with us, and friends who have moved on. So, really, our 20th season of concerts is a celebration of our history and an affirmation of our excitement about the future.

We have a joyful and thought-provoking season lined up for 2018-2019, one that will include toe tapping, delight, and awe that such musical beauty has existed in this world for hundreds of years and we get to experience it here and now!


